REPORT TO CNSC FINDS NO SAFETY ISSUES AT OPG PLANTS

A four-month examination of Ontario Power Generation's (OPG) nuclear operations following the earthquake and tsunami and resulting nuclear accident at Fukushima has uncovered no major safety issues.

These findings are in a report submitted to the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC). This report supplements reports that were filed on May 28 and April 28 of this year. OPG will continue to work with nuclear operators, regulators and industry associations as the situation in Japan unfolds in the coming months.

OPG carefully studied the safety of its facilities and re-evaluated the potential impacts of unlikely events such earthquakes, severe flooding, tornadoes, hurricanes, fire and ice storms having major impacts on nuclear operations.

The studies showed that the plants continued to be safe, but as part of continuous improvement OPG will make investments to increase safety margins during these unlikely events. This includes accelerating the installation of hydrogen recombiners and the purchase of additional back up generation and diesel pumps.
