ONTARIO POWER GENERATION APPLIES TO NUCLEAR REGULATOR FOR LICENCE RENEWALS

[Durham]: Ontario Power Generation has begun the process of relicencing for three of its nuclear facilities with its regulator, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission.

Over the next few months, hearings will be held in Ottawa and Oshawa for five-year licence renewals of the Darlington and Pickering B Nuclear stations, and for a 10-year renewal of the licence to operate the Pickering Waste Management Facility.
