

# QUARTERLY UPDATE TO THE COMMUNITY



In the first quarter of this year, Darlington Nuclear achieved a significant safety milestone when they surpassed six million hours worked without a lost-time accident. This means our 2,500 employees have worked without a lost-time injury since May 2008. The achievement of this milestone is the result of a commitment to workplace safety that is shared by everyone - employees, management, unions and Darlington's Joint Health and Safety Committee.

Public and employee safety is our primary focus, and safety is built into every task we do. This is a tremendous achievement, not just in the nuclear industry but for any industrial environment. This is especially true considering last year's Vacuum Building Outage, a 40-day station outage that involved more than 4,000 OPG employees and our valued industry partners.

I'm proud of this achievement. It's a reflection of the commitment our staff has to workplace safety and to the safe, efficient and cost-effective operation of Darlington Nuclear.

## Q1 HIGHLIGHTS FROM DARLINGTON NUCLEAR

- OPG announced a two-part investment strategy for its current nuclear generating stations in Durham Region. OPG will proceed with the detailed planning for the mid-life refurbishment of Darlington Nuclear, with construction expected to start in about 2016. OPG will also invest an additional \$300 million in its Pickering B station. OPG will continue operation of Pickering Nuclear for approximately 10 years, before beginning decommissioning project work.
