DURING THE SECOND QUARTER OF 2009

- Darlington Nuclear successfully completed its largest and most complex project for the year - the Vacuum Building Outage was completed safely and in a timely matter.
- In support of biodiversity in the community, Darlington Nuclear hosted its annual Scouts Canada tree planting event in May. OPG staff, Scouts, and community volunteers helped plant 250 large Silver Maple trees on the Darlington site.
- Darlington Tritium Removal Facility employees achieved 10 years without a lost time injury.
- *Looking ahead:* Darlington Nuclear's Waste Management Facility licence will be reviewed at a mid-term Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (www.cnscccsn.gc.ca) hearing in January 2010. Strong regulatory oversight is just one of the many safety systems in place at each of our nuclear sites.
